1	Call to Order Les called the meeting to order at 7:33 p.m. and welcomed the new Board members, Blaine, John and Kerry.	
2	Approval of February 20, 2025 Meeting Minutes It was moved by Gord, seconded by Les, that the minutes of February 20, 2025 be approved. Motion carried.	
3	Approval of the Agenda Donation to Fort Heritage Precinct and Acceptance of Artifact Transfer from AGHS were added to the agenda.	
4.	Treasurers Report Les is working on getting Blaine set up as the treasurer. One GIC for \$23,000 matured and made \$977.50 in interest and another two-year GIC made \$954.50 in the first year. The funds were put in the business savings account, which now has a balance of \$40,414.26. Another \$23,000 or \$25,000 should be put into a GIC so one matures every year. The interest rate would be 2.9% for two years, which would be \$725 a year. Les moved, Gord seconded, that \$25,000 be deposited into a two-year GIC from the business savings account. Motion carried Gord wondered about setting aside some capital and opening an endowment fund in a few years. A proposal should be created and include what the fund could be used for. It may be similar to an RRSP account. The GICs could be placed in such an account when they mature. Les reported that the Society gained 7 new adult annual members since January 1.	

	Tim Harding and Bruce Winton made donations and Les and Gord made donations to the Society in memory of Monroe Kinloch. There has been \$2943 in income and \$709.80 in expenses so far this year and the only expense was for storage. The Stripe program is supposed to generate emails regarding membership renewals.

	Expanding Membership

Hopefully the annual members renew their memberships. \$1800 has been budgeted for 6 life memberships, \$1200 for 40 annual memberships and \$100 for 5 student memberships. Everyone needs to think about a strategy to expand the membership outside of surveying to increase the revenue and get more members who want to be involved. Les may attend a grant writing seminar. The Dominion Survey System got way more hits than anything else on the website. He would like to have a meeting with Troy regarding SEO. This should not be a problem since the Society has duplicates of the transit and the chain is a	

	reproduction. Gord wondered if the Precinct would be willing to help develop a standard presentation for teachers to use. Perhaps Hal could be involved since he lives in Fort Saskatchewan. It was moved by Gord, seconded by Les, that the Alberta Geomatics Historical Society unconditionally donate the following objects to the Fort Heritage Precinct, City of Fort Saskatchewan: ALSA 2007.03.01 Gunter's Chain ALSA 2008.10.04 Plumb bob with gammon reel and leather case ALSA 2008.10.18 Transit, Cooke Troughton & Simms ALSA 2010.07.04 Tension Handle Motion carried.	Gord and Hal Gord will update the information in Past Perfect, arrange for the transfer of the artifacts and see if the Precinct would be willing to help develop a standard presentation for teachers to use.
	6i. Acceptance of Artifact Transfer from the Surveyors Historical Foundation (SHF) The SHF, a registered charity, had 80 objects that were held by the ALSA under a loan agreement. The SHF transferred them to the AGHS in January. The SHF has requested a formal acceptance of the transfer to facilitate their report to the CRA. The accession numbers will remain the same as articles have been written using the numbers so it would be confusing if they didn't. It was moved by Gord, seconded by John, that the objects listed below that were transferred to the Alberta Geomatics Historical Society by the Alberta Historical and Educational Foundation for Land Surveying (Surveyors Historical Foundation) on January 8, 2025 be accepted: Accession SHF 2015.01: Approx 60 objects formerly belong to R.
